Move forward three spaces.







You visit your local school or college to talk about politics. It goes well.

Move back two spaces.






You do not answer a query from a local resident quickly enough.


They go to the local paper.

Move forward two spaces.












The Electoral Commission

Move forward three spaces.







A sewerage plant is being built in your area. You fought this all the way.

Move forward three spaces.










There is an election coming up and your party is very popular. It is likely that you will be re-elected.
